<u>Access to Baby and Child Dentistry (ABCD)</u>: puts young children across Washington state on a lifelong path to good oral health.

<u>Boys & Girls Club</u>: Members ages 6 to 18 years-old get a no-cost Boys & Girls Club basic membership, covered by Coordinated Care.

<u>Camping and day use entry to WA State Parks</u>: Free campsite and day use entry to foster and kinship care families with dependent children.

<u>Camp Ten Trees</u>: Residential camping programs for LGBTQ+ youth and youth of LGBTQ+ families.

WASHINGTON STATE AND NATIONAL PROGRAMS CONTINUED

<u>God's Closet</u>: Children's Clothing closet in with locations in: Deer Park, East Wenatchee, and Spokane, Yakima, Monroe, Des Moines, Lacey, and Vancouver.

<u>IFoster</u>: A free, members-only community supporting children in or at-risk of entry into child welfare, to access the resources and opportunities they need to become successful.

<u>Imagination Library of Washington</u>: Enroll your child online. In 6-8 weeks, your child will receive their first book in the mail, 'The Little Engine That Could'. Books arrive in the mail monthly until your child's 5th birthday.

Kids Bowl Free: Select bowling centers participate in the Kids Bowl Free program.

Royal Family Kids' Camp: Summer camp especially designed with foster children in mind.

<u>Sibling Strong</u>: Reunites brothers and sisters who have Washington ties and who are separated because of foster care and other out-of-home care for camps and events that reinforce their sibling connection.

<u>Team Celebrate</u>: Provides Birthday cards and party supplies in Bellingham, Bothell, Bremerton, Burlington, Cowlitz County, Federal Way, Issaquah, Pasco, Poulsbo, Spokane.

<u>Ted Brown Music Outreach</u>: Scholarships for free or reduced cost instruments. In addition they offer Instrument Exploration Camps.

<u>Treehouse</u>: Offers many programs to youth across the state including educational support, holiday gifts, driver's assistance, a clothing closet and just in time funding program.

Mo's Place: Supports foster families in the Tri-Cities, Walla Walla, and the surrounding areas through networking, encouragement, training, and engagement.

Gold's Gym in TriCities: Provide a valid foster care license or pocket card to receive the discount. \$0 enrollment fee, \$29 per month, \$39 annual fee 60 days from the starting point. This is per person. It is also a 1-year agreement. Members do have to be 12yrs and up to use the gym floor. Email judy@goldsgym.fitness for more information and to sign up.



<u>Splash & Swim School</u>: In TriCities offers 20% discounts for foster families. Please show your foster parent license or pocket card to receive the discount.

<u>Voices for Children</u>: Gives buddy bags and has a Wish and Need fund available throughout the Yakima Valley.

Blue Skies for Children: Sponsor enrichment activities like academic and educational services plus Little Wishes and Winter Warm Up programs.

<u>Clothes for Kids</u>: Children who attend school in Snohomish County or the Northshore School District can shop the clothing closet.

<u>Foster Closet</u>: Provides free clothing, toys, childcare items to families caring for foster children in Whatcom, Island, Skagit, and Snohomish counties.

<u>Museum of Flight</u>: Receive 50% off general admission for foster parents and FREE admission for youth. *Also available to families outside the region.

<u>Pacific Science Center</u>: Two types of discounts available for foster youth. *Also available to families outside the region.

<u>Seattle Angels</u>: The Love Box program provides fostering families with community and holistic support. The Dare to Dream program provides one-on-one mentorship to youth in care.

<u>Seattle Aquarium</u>: Free for 2 caregiving adults and up to 6 children living in the same household. *Also available to families outside the region.

<u>Ali's prom project</u>: Provides formal dresses for youth in care *Also available to families outside the region.

<u>Tacoma Children's Museum</u>: Free memberships for all foster families in Pierce County.

Point Defiance Zoo & Aquarium: Up to 6 daytime admission tickets for \$5 each for you and your immediate family members. An annual Wild Access membership for \$40. This household membership covers 2 named adults and all legal dependents ages 3-18. Children 2 and under are always free.

Bridge the Gap: Bridge the Gap provides funds to cover activities, summer camps, etc. for kids in Clark, Cowlitz and Skamania Counties.

<u>Cloth+Foster</u>: Meeting the needs of families and children experiencing foster care through tangible goods, in SW Washington and surrounding areas.

<u>Capital Kids Connection</u>: Christmas gifts, School supplies, \$100 wishes for youth to go towards an item or experience of their choice. For children in Thurston, Mason and Lewis Counties.

<u>Compelled to Care</u>: Provides graduation gifts, Care Boxes, and school supplies for kids entering the foster care system. Support dinners in Thurston and Grays Harbor counties.

<u>Dry Tikes and Wet Wipes</u>: Supplements the diaper needs of low-income families. Serving the Olympia, Lacey, Tumwater, and surrounding area.

<u>Foster Supports of Jefferson County</u>: Services include clothing closet, Kicks for Kids, and Academic Success for Kids Program.

Hands On Children's Museum: Offers a \$25 membership to youth with a PEBT card. *Also available to families outside the region.

Olympic Angels: The Love Box program provides fostering families with community and holistic support. The Dare to Dream program provides one-on-one mentorship to youth in care.

<u>Pizza Klatch</u>: Offers support group for LGBTQ+ youth and their allies; held in classrooms during lunchtime at participating schools in the following districts: North Thurston, Tumwater, Olympia, Rainier, Tenino, Rochester, and Yelm Community Schools.

South Sound Foster/Adoptive Clothing Closet: Free clothing for ages 0-12, shoes, gear, strollers, toys, etc.

The Wishing Well Foundation: Provides clothing, supplies, and experiences to children currently placed in the foster care system in Thurston County.
