Becoming a licensed foster parent can feel overwhelming. Just take it one step at a time. Keep this checklist handy to track your progress or reference as you're moving forward! You can check things off in whichever order works for you.

This training is offered as a self-paced eLearning through <a href="mailto:risewiththealliance.org/">risewiththealliance.org/</a>

<u>WAC 110-148-1375</u> requires all caregivers over the age of 18 to complete the following to get licensed: First Aid, and Age-appropriate, adult or infant, CPR training that meets nationally recognized standards set by the American Heart Association.

## ☐ Complete First-Aid and CPR

\*Required for all caregivers over the age of 18

- Search the web for an in-person class near you that fits the age group you want to care for (adult, child, and infant certifications are available).
- Verify with the trainer that the class meets national standards set by the American Heart Association.
- o Keep your receipt and certification card.

<ul> <li>Once your license is issued, you can request reimbursement for the class from your licensor.</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>Complete Blood Borne Pathogens Training.</li> <li>*Required for all caregivers over the age of 18</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>You may take BBP in your CPR Class or through the Alliance: <u>Bloodborne Pathogens</u> (<u>eLearning</u>)   <u>UW School of Social Work Professional Education</u></li> </ul>
Once you have completed the required training, if you are licensing with DCYF, contact the licensing department who will send you a link to the WA CAP application portal.

If you are licensing with a Child Placing Agency, contact the Agency for further licensing instructions.
<ul> <li>After you complete your licensing application, a licensor will contact you to conduct an in-person interview including your household members.</li> </ul>
□ The Licensor will also conduct a Home Inspection using the Foster Home Licensing Inspection Checklist. <a href="DCYF Forms">DCYF Forms</a>   Washington State Department of Children, Youth, and Families
<ul> <li>Once the home study is complete, you will receive a draft to review before it is final and you are given a copy along with your license.</li> </ul>

The licensing process takes approximately 120 days from the day you start the WA CAP application.
